From the Rector:

Have You Made an Adult Profession of Faith?

As the bishop's annual visit approaches, this is the time to start thinking about Baptism, Confirmation, and Reception. Although we will not include these rituals in his visit this year, we will offer a class this spring to anyone interested so that you may be baptized, confirmed, or received at the next upcoming opportunity. Many of us were baptized as infants or children. If you were not, or if you have not had your own children baptized, the opportunities this year will be The Feast of Pentecost (May 23), and All Saints' Sunday (Nov 7). Teens and adults may attend the Confirmation Class, while parents and godparents of infants will have a separate class. If you were baptized as a child, perhaps you were also confirmed as a teenager or young adult. However, many members may have missed the chance to do this. Confirmation is our adult profession of faith; parents and godparents made promises on our behalf at infant baptism, so this is our chance to profess what we believe and to commit to Christ with our own words as adults. This can be done at any adult age, and we will hold a special Adult Confirmation Class. High schoolers who are interested in Confirmation should also contact Mother Megan so we can determine how to hold a class for this group. Just what is Reception? Well, a reception is

something with cake and punch that we hold after special events. But "Reception" is much more

according to the Book of Common Prayer! Oftentimes as adults we move from one church to another, or from one denomination to another. If you were baptized and confirmed in another Christian denomination but wish to become an official Episcopalian, we say that you are "received" into the Episcopal Church. The process of "Reception" happens at the bishop's annual visit along with Confirmation. Those wishing to be received may also attend the Adult Confirmation Class.

Please consider how you might make your adult profession of faith. If you wish to attend the class, you don't have to commit to the entire process. At the end of the class, if you are not yet ready to make a commitment or decision, you can consider it again next year.

If you are interested in Baptism, Confirmation, or Reception, please contact Mother Megan at the church office or at immanuelrector@gmail.com. Once I know how many we have, we will determine class dates for this spring and/or the fall.

With this addition, the new quantifiable total for 2009's outreach was \$9,472.

Treasurer's Report

Here's an overview of our 2010 budget:

Consequently, our budget will require a transfer of \$91,000 (\$38,000 + \$53,000). That will be over 9% of our investment funds and represents

41% of our budget. Long term we will not be able to continue this trend. The vestry will continue to explore ways to increase our income. If we can't increase income significantly, it will require us to cut expenses in the future.

Boy Scouts of America is 100 years young!

On Feb. 28, Immanuel's Troop 485 joined the congregation for their annual church parade, presenting the scout flag and the national colors, and we marked the beginning of scouting in America on February 8, 1910. It was Inspired by the example of scouting in Great Britain, first organized in 1907 by Robert Baden-Powell (whose initials go with the motto: Be Prepared).

Troop 485 began at Immanuel on December 12, 1951 under the leadership of Alfred Sharp. The troop now has 40 scouts and 20 leaders. This month the scoutmaster, Gene Ruhl, was awarded the Silver Beaver, the highest recognition given to leaders by the B.S.A., one given also to Al Sharp. The troop has raised up 65 Eagle Scouts. The boys help in the care of our campus, including energetic efforts each spring and fall in weeding, trimming and raking the tons of leaves nature gives us.

Buzz treasures the story of how the man who started American scouting, William Boyer of Chicago, went to England to meet Lord Baden-Powell. When he disembarked on the coast near the general's home he lost his way in a swirling fog, but a young boy appeared and guided him safely to the house. Gratefully Mr. Boyer began to give him money but he said "No thank you, sir; I won't take money for helping. I am a Boy Scout." No-one knows the boy's name but every February 8 he is remembered by American scouts as the scout who helped bring scouting to America.


