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From the Rector:

"Feed my sheep" --John 1:15

The apostolic church knew that its greatest responsibility and its most wonderful privilege were to share the good news about God in Christ Jesus: we are, always, everyone, everywhere, beloved and loving, forgiven and forgiving, truly alive.

The disciples, who had been "as sheep without a shepherd," were themselves changed into shepherds called to share with one another and all the lost sheep--including those who somehow thought they were not lost

As Immanuel enters into a new year and a new era, we realize that "feeding" those entrusted to our care requires counting them (that's how the shepherd knew one of his 100 lambs was missing).

Unfortunately for many years we have not kept careful track of our communicants, that is, those 16 or over who have been confirmed by a bishop, here or, if elsewhere, transferred in. I hope to bring our parish register up to date, but I need your help.

I am making four lists:

#1 is of those who have been entered as confirmed or transferred from another church and who are currently active in supporting our ministries and worship (I count about 38).

#2 is of those active but not recorded as communicants (there are at least 60 of you). They are to tell us when and where they were confirmed or received and, as needed, we will send a Letter of Transfer to the former churches--or we will ask if you might be interested in Confirmation when the Bishop of Maryland visits us this spring.

#3 is of those who are on our current mailing list but who, for whatever reason, are not active supporters, perhaps because they belong to other parishes but attend Immanuel with family or friends (about 40).

#4 includes all those who were on old communicant lists who have not, so far as we know, moved away or died or joined another church--at least 30 folks.

If all this sounds a bit too bureaucratic, be assured that *all people* who look to Immanuel as their home in Christ are members of his body--

welcome to receive at his table and to share in our fellowship, learning and outreach. It has been truly said, "Administering is ministering."

Highlights from the December 14th Vestry Meeting

There will be two services on Christmas Eve and one on Christmas morning. The Vestry agreed the Christmas Offering would be allocated to one local charity and one international charity. The local charity is the Maryland Fuel Fund and the balance of the funds would be sent to Haiti via Tracy Bruce, Rector of St. John's in Glyndon. Reverend Bruce has been instrumental in helping a Haitian Music School rebuild following the earthquake's devastation.

Pastor Smith is working on updating Immanuel's Church Register, the official record of all Church members, baptisms, confirmations, etc. The Register has not been updated since 1995 -- more than 15 years ago! This is a large undertaking and we are most fortunate Pastor Smith is willing and able to take on such a project. More information will be forthcoming on this in the future.

ANNUAL MEETING - 2010

The Annual Meeting of Immanuel Church took place on Sunday, November 14, 2010, in the church, beginning at 11:15am. Our rector, The Rev. Megan Stewart-Sicking, presided. There were approximately 60 members present. The following summarizes the proceedings.

Mary Frances Wagley gave the Stewardship Committee report. Mary Frances reported approximately \$110,000 in pledges had been committed as of the date of the meeting.

Chuck Gilbert presented the Treasurer's report. This included projected income and expense

information through the end of 2010. Chuck estimated income and expenses for 2010 will total \$140,468 and \$219,572, respectively. This will require a transfer of \$79,104 from the Church's Investment Account. The amount of this transfer is consistent with prior years going back to 2006, with the exception of 2007 and 2008, in which we withdrew \$59,212 and \$44,030, respectively. The estimated balance in the Investment Fund Account at 12/31/10 is \$1,017,646.

Chuck also circulated summary budget information for 2011. He and the Finance Committee have reduced 2011 budgeted expenses as much as possible without negatively impacting any programs. Income for 2011 is budgeted for \$130,300, requiring a transfer from the Investment Account of \$78,108. Chuck encouraged any one who is interested in more detail to contact him for a complete copy of the 2011 budget once it is finalized. Additionally, all Vestry meetings are open and any one interested in learning more about the Church's budgeting process is welcome and encouraged to attend the meetings.

Rev. Megan Stewart-Sicking, Rudi Horner, Senior Warden, and Doug Whatley, Junior Warden, presented proposed changes to the Church's by-laws. The first change involved an update to the wording in Article I, Section 2. The second, more significant change entailed reducing the number of Vestry in Article II, Section 2, from twelve to nine. Note, the number of officers would remain unchanged; there are currently four officers: Senior and Junior Wardens, Treasurer and Registrar. The congregation voted in favor of the changes as proposed.

Rev. Megan Stewart-Sicking presented Carole Hayes as a candidate for the Vestry. This was approved by those present at the meeting.

Dr. Alex Haller, Immanuel's Representative to the Horizons Gathering, provided a report on the Diocesan program, Horizons 2015, following the acronym PEACE. He gave an update on Bishop Sutton's progress and thinking towards establishing a new Episcopal school in Baltimore

City and encouraged everyone to continue to be aware of, and responsive to, the Diocese's efforts to turn these plans into realities.

The Annual Meeting was not officially closed since the parish needs to vote on a second candidate for Vestry, once that candidate is identified.

After the Annual Meeting, we had a pot-luck lunch with major portions prepared by the "Men of Immanuel".

Reflecting on the Season of New Beginnings

This message is being written in Advent, the season of new beginnings. We have been reminded in the sermons and our Adult Education sessions that this period of shorter days and longer darkness is actually not an end, but a beginning. And, last year at this very time our parish embarked on a new beginning with a new rector. Let us give thanks, especially during this season, for the new ministry and ministries that Megan, Joe and Sam have initiated with us and the combined ministries that we all share as the faith community of Immanuel Church.
