## *From the Rector:*

### *Let the Pledging Begin!*

It is tempting to start this note by saying that “stewardship season begins.” However, you will probably hear me talk a lot this year about our “annual pledge campaign” rather than “annual stewardship campaign.” As we have all been reminded many times, stewardship is not a season. It is not about one type of giving at one time of year. Stewardship is about our care for every resource, at all times. This is why we honored a “creation season” in September. We remembered our great responsibility for all natural resources, and we celebrated the joy we find in all God’s creation. The only change in October is that we go from considering stewardship of global resources to stewardship of personal resources.

Well, there is one other change. The actual pledge campaign begins! We cannot make a budget without you. We cannot figure out which ministry areas to grow without you. And we cannot figure out where we need to cut without you. Without a pledge, it’s like you making an annual budget when your employer hasn’t given you your income level for the next year yet. It would be impossible to make commitments!

Essentially, this is how our vestry struggles each fall. We must make the budget for 2012, and to do that, we need your help. Please remember that your pledge can change if your circumstances

Though names will be kept confidential, we will formally dedicate and bless all pledges received by October 23.

## ***Highlights from the September 13<sup>th</sup> Vestry Meeting***

The Vestry, meeting Sept 13, 2011, agreed that our existing part-time, paid position of Sunday School Administrator will be extended through the first half of the church's next budget year of 2012. The position had been confirmed through 2011 when this year's budget was finalized. The

Vestry heartily welcomes Anne Greene who's already an experienced Sunday School teacher at Immanuel.

The Vestry noted that the position of Sunday School Administrator is critical not only because of the popularity of our Sunday School and its pattern of offering exciting Sunday mornings to the children of the Parish, but because the Rector will be on maternity leave for 8 weeks sometime in winter - early spring 2012. Additionally, the Parish is beginning a Middle School/Youth Group during Sunday School hours, and the Sunday School Administrator will have a role in that program.

The Church's roof was professionally, successfully repaired before Hurricane Irene and the more recent extremely heavy rains. The plaster repairs in the Narthex will soon be made.

The ceiling light in the Narthex and the big light over the exterior entrance of the Church are on the same circuit and switch. The timer-switch was replaced without fixing the problem, but verifying that an electrical repair to the circuit is required. This work will be performed before we have another evening service.

The tree removal next to the Rectory is scheduled for Tuesday, Sept 27, as already indicated on the Parish's on-line Calendar. The Vestry had studied our on-line Calendar in preparation for the meeting, so there was much praise for the on-line Calendar which goes through 2012. We hope this resource will allow members and friends of the Parish to add the dates, times, and natures of more distant, yet upcoming, events to their personal calendars before their personal calendars get filled.

Immanuel will run at least a couple of invitation/advertisements in the "County Chronicle" to encourage people who live in the area but are not affiliated with the Parish to visit and/or join us.

The Annual Parish meeting will be Sunday, Nov. 13. On Sunday, Nov. 6, we will celebrate All

Saints Sunday, including a Baptism. The Church plans to announce later the dates of one autumn 2011 and one spring 2012 Morning Prayer with Choir 10:15 a.m. service.

We are looking into what the Episcopal Diocese of Central Pennsylvania needs to assist its relief efforts following Hurricane Irene in that neighboring region. We will develop an Outreach Committee to stay in touch with all of the Parish's diverse outreach efforts.
